Accushield Kiosks

In August of 2022, we started using the Accushield Kiosks at Christian Care for visitors, volunteers, service providers and staff to sign in upon entering our building. Currently we have our COVID screening questions as part of the sign in process. Accushield offers the flexibility to change messages and questions during the screening process to keep up with regulations.

However Accushield provides more than screening individuals for COVID. Recently the city of Bluffton was under a tornado warning. The business office quickly generated an Accushield report showing all family & friends, service providers, staff and volunteers that were in the building. This is a great safety tool to account for everyone in our building during an emergency. So that we can be accurate in an emergency situation, we ask that when you leave to please sign out on the kiosk. That can be done on the mobile app as well as signing in.

Another Accushield benefit is we can tell which residents aren't getting visitors and may need more support from our Activities Department. We acknowledge that there can be a line at the kiosks, especially during events at the facility. One solution to reduce the wait time is to download the Accushield app onto your phone:

Nursing


